- RRLC Access Cards are issued to users needing extensive use of other participating library collections. While not designed as a replacement for interlibrary loan, the program will assist researchers in need of resources outside the collections of their home libraries.

RRLC Access is a cooperative effort of the participating area libraries of the Rochester Regional Library Council to aid long-term research.

How to Get an Access Card

Ask the librarian at your home library for an RRLC Access Card.

Your home library will issue you a non-transferable (can only be used by you) RRLC Access Card. The card expires on June 30 of each year.

How to Use an Access Card

An RRLC Access Card is valid at any participating library. Materials can be borrowed within the rules and restrictions set by the lending library.

Each RRLC Access Card is non-transferable and can be used by the person to whom it was issued.

Use of the RRLC Access Card is subject to the rules of each participating library.

Cost for the replacement of lost or damaged materials or overdue fines are payable by the person whose signature appears on the card.

The card does not give automatic entrance to the card holder.

Cards are valid for a maximum of one year, from July 1 to June 30, with no automatic renewals.

Be Responsible!

Cost for the replacement of lost or damaged materials is the responsibility of the borrower. Your library is ultimately responsible for the return of materials, so please help them by returning materials on time.
